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KDOT to begin field survey for U.S. 166 overpass

Starting Monday, Feb. 23, and continuing for three weeks, weather permitting, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) will conduct a field survey at the U.S. 166 railroad overpass located two miles east of the Chautauqua-Montgomery county line.

The survey length is approximately 2,000 feet along the existing alignment of U.S. 166. The survey is taking place to gather information necessary for a detailed design of a proposed project to replace the overpass. Activities will include the use of survey instruments on the ground to determine locations of existing features within the corridor.

A member of the survey crew will first contact property owners and/or tenants for permission to enter private property. Rob Selley, P.S., Field Survey Project Manager, is in charge of this survey for KDOT.
